

DIVISION XIV POULTRY

Poultry will be judged by the following standards:

- Health and vigor, uniformity of development, size and weight
- Apparent sexual maturity in breeding lots
- Degree of finish and fleshing in market lots
- Freedom from defects
- Breed characteristics as to color and size
- Show condition – free of manure, grease, mud and external parasites. Clean and bright.
- Different animals for 4-H and open class.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own feed. All ages show together.
- Same animal can not be shown in two separate lots.
